The Proston & District Heritage Assn, along with the Proston State School, are progressing with plans for a big weekend of Centenary celebrations on 30th September & 1st October 2023.

Organisers expect a large crowd to return to Proston for a joint celebration of 100 years since the coming of the rail, which signalled the beginnings of the township of Proston, as well as 100 years since the opening of the Proston State School.

Two community meetings have been held with another meeting planned for the 19th November to map out a programme of events and activities for the weekend.

Ideas include a parade, market stalls and food vendors, class photos, displays and stalls at the school, an official opening at "The Platform" in Railway Park, the launch of the centenary book, railway tours, bus tours around the local district, a Centenary Ball and a screening of Bill Keys' Proston movie.

Suggestions for events on the Sunday include a thanksgiving service, the official opening of the Proston Village shops and the Proston Men's Shed, old time sports in the park (remember those inter-school ball games -get your teams ready Abbeywood, Speedwell, Brigooda etc), readings from the centenary book, billy tea and

damper and fireworks.

And for those who still have energy left, there is the possibility of a walk through Reinke Scrub Conservation Park on Monday morning.

It is anticipated that upwards of 1000 people will be returning to Proston over the weekend and it will require community coordination to accommodate, feed, transport and entertain such a large gathering of people.

You are invited to attend the next Community Centenary meeting to be held in the Proston Community Hall on Saturday 19th November commencing at 1.30pm.


