Cut Flowers

Cut Flowers must have been grown by the Exhibitor. Use clean, clear or green bottles. 'Container' may be of own choice. Oasis allowed.

KIND: Rose, Dahlia, Begonia, TYPE- Hybrid Tea (HT)
Rose, Double Gerbera, Cactus Dahlia

VARIETY: Rose Mr Lincoln, Geranium Apple Blossom
Rosebud, Red Baurerii Gerbera

BLOOM: Flower as in Rose, or a group of flowers as in Germanium, Gladiolus, Shrub spike

STEM: One stem with no side-buds, foliage allowed
e.g. one rose, one Dahlia

CUT: Side-buds, branching and foliage allowed.
Counted from the top of the vessel e.g. one, three.

1. One stem, HT type rose bud, up to 3 petals unfurled or 25% open
2. One stem, HT type rose, stem may be wired
3. One stem or cut, any Floribunda or Polyanthus variety
4. One stem or cut, any mini-flora Rose
5. One stem or cut, English Heritage or Shrub Rose
6. Three stems of Roses, of one variety, any type, 3 stages of opening in one vessel
7. Three stems or cuts of different Roses, same stage of opening in one vessel
8. Container of mixed Roses, minimum of 5 stems and or cuts, minimum of 3 varieties

9. One decorative Dahlia, diameter over 15cm
10. One decorative Dahlia, diameter 15cm and under
11. One Cactus Dahlia, diameter over 15cm
12. One Cactus Dahlia, diameter 15cm and under
13. One Dahlia, any other type
14. Three Dahlias, three different varieties
15. Collection of Dahlias, minimum 5 stems
16. One Carnation
17. Three Carnations, three different colours
18. One Gerbera, semi double or double
19. One Gerbera, single
20. One Gerbera, Dutch hybrid
21. One Gerbera, Baueri Hybrid
22. Three Gerberas, different colours
23. Collection of Gerberas, minimum 5 stems
24. Three stems, three cut flowers, different kinds

Miscellaneous

25. Three Marigolds, large African
26. Three Marigolds, French
27. Three Zinneas, large (over 6cm)
28. Three Zinneas, small (6cm and under)
29. Geranium, one head
30. Ivy geranium, one head on stem, with leaf
31. Collection of Geraniums, minimum 5 stems
32. Collection of Petunias, minimum 5 stems
33. Three stems, any coloured foliage, can be mixed kinds
34. Blooms: container of mixed stems and/or cuts, minimum 5 kinds or types
35. One stem or cut, shrub or tree bloom, not native
36. One stem or cut native bloom
37. Protea, one bloom
38. Collection of shrub blooms, minimum 5 stems
39. Bloom, one cut, any kind not previously specified
40. Bloom, one stem, one kind not previously specified
41. Blooms, 3 stems or cuts, one kind not previously specified

Potted Plants

Plants must be owned by the exhibitor for a minimum of two (2) months. Plants must be in manageable sized containers.

42. One Coleus
43. One Begonia
44. One Palm
45. One Syngonium (Arrow Leaf Plant)
46. One Prayer plant or Peacock plant
47. Cactus, one variety
48. Succulent, one variety
49. One Bromeliad
50. Bromeliads, hanging or potted, one variety
51. One plant in bloom
52. Terrarium, maximum size 30cmx30cm
53. Container garden, maximum size 30cmx30cm
54. Foxtail asparagus in pot or hanger
55. Nephrolepis fern (Boston fern) in pot or hanger
56. Maidenhair fern in pot or hanger
57. Other variety of fern in pot or hanger
58. Hanging plant not previously specified
59. Any other potted indoor plant, not specified
60. Orchid in bloom
